PLANNING AND ZONING – REZONING ORDINANCE (FIRST READING)

#2357 – Marie Barnes Hubbard Trust. . . and HC Holdings, LLC

County Judge-Executive Dean Watts presented in open Court for first reading the following proposed ordinance amending the zoning map for Nelson County, which change was presented in accordance with the zoning regulations and has been reviewed and recommended for approval by the Joint City-County Planning and Zoning Commission as evidenced by written notice to that effect.

Said proposed ordinance was read in open Court in resume form and a full copy of the proposed ordinance is as follows:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND ADOPTING AS AMENDED ZONING MAP ENTITLED “ZONING MAP, CITIES OF BARDSTOWN, BLOOMFIELD, FAIRFIELD, NEW HAVEN AND NELSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY”

BY CHANGING THE DISTRICT CLASSIFICATION OF PROPERTY LOCATED IN NELSON COUNTY AS HEREINAFTER DESCRIBED FROM A-1, AGRICULTURAL DISTRICT TO BE REZONED AS B-3, REGIONAL RETAIL BUSINESS DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, the Joint City-County Planning Commission of Nelson County, Kentucky, on July 12, 2011 held a public hearing under the provisions of KRS Chapter 100, and after careful consideration, the Commission on July 26, 2011, voted to approve and recommend the amendment to the Fiscal Court of Nelson County.

SECTION I: Boundaries of the district as shown on district map entitled "ZONING MAP, CITIES OF BARDSTOWN, BLOOMFIELD, FAIRFIELD, NEW HAVEN AND NELSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY" be and the same are hereby amended for reasons adopted and stated in the recommendation of the Joint City-County Planning Commission all of which is made a part hereof as if fully set out herein, including the letter of recommendation dated July 28, 2011, from the said Joint City-County Planning Commission of Nelson County to the Nelson County Fiscal Court, so that the following described property of Marie Barnes Hubbard Trust – John Douglas Hubbard, Trustee (Applicant/Owner) and Rayfield Houghlin & Susan D. Clark (HC Holdings, LLC) (Co-Applicants/Buyers), is presently A-1, Agricultural District be and the same is placed as B-3, Regional Retail Business District and said property is described as follows:

The Point of Reference is the common corner between Barnes, et al and Monin, on the r/w line of KY Hwy 245; thence N 50-04-47 W 722.66 ft. to a ½" iron pin (set) "HIBBS 2981", in the r/w line of KY Hwy 245, the Point of Beginning; thence leaving the road with a division across Barnes, et al S 32-58-24 W 459.31 ft. to a W' iron pin (set) "HIBBS 2981"; thence N 52-07-47 W 208.53 ft. to a ½" iron pin (set) "HIBBS 2981"; thence N 02-46-08 E 184.78 ft. to a ½" iron pin (set) "HIBBS 2981"; thence N 32-58-24 E 300.00 ft. to a ½" iron pin (set) "HIBBS 2981", corner to Barnes, et al, in the r/w line of KY Hwy 245; thence with said r/w line S 57-01-36 E 103.17 ft. to a ½" iron pin (set) "HIBBS 2981"; thence S 51-46-06E 198.40 ft. to the point of beginning, containing 3.00 acres



Said proposed ordinance was read in open Court in resume form and a fully copy of the ordinance is as follows:

**ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE SETTING OF PROPERTY TAX RATES  
TO FUND THE 2011-2012 BUDGET OF THE COUNTY OF NELSON**

WHEREAS the County adopted a budget for the 2011-12 fiscal year on June 7, 2011; and

WHEREAS property tax rates to fund the said budget could not be adopted prior to the County's receipt of the State Local Finance Officer's Certification of the Maximum Permissible Revenue from ad valorem taxes in accordance with KRS 68.245, which was received July 21, 2011; and

WHEREAS the said certification establishes compensating and maximum tax rates for the County;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDERED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF THE COUNTY OF NELSON, KENTUCKY:

SECTION ONE: There is levied for the year 2011 the ad valorem tax rates per \$100.00 assessed valuation on all taxable property with the County for General Fund as indicated:

### NELSON COUNTY LIVESTOCK IMPROVEMENT ASSOCIATION CONTRIBUTION -

Adam Wheatley, on behalf of the Nelson County agricultural community, extended appreciation to Nelson Fiscal Court for nine years of assistance through the County's dead animal disposal program. In partnership with Nelson Fiscal Court, and as a means of helping offset expenses incurred due to this program, Wheatley presented a check to Nelson Fiscal Court with a check for \$8,500 from the Nelson County Livestock Improvement Association, a group which represents the majority of the livestock associations within the county.

KENTUCKY AGRICULTURAL DEVELOPMENT GRANT - Notice was given Friday that Nelson County's application for funds for a deceased animal truck was approved: "\$30,000 Fallen Animal Removal Truck Nelson Fiscal Court was approved for \$30,000 in Nelson County funds to purchase a truck for hauling fallen animals to the local landfill for proper disposal."

This grant is a cost reimbursement grant; KADF will match 50 cents on the dollar up to \$30,000. Plan is to use bed off truck now in use for deal animal disposal; the truck will be sold, with amount to be used toward purchase of a new truck. Following receipt of agreement from KADF, on motion of Bernard Ice, second of Jerry Hahn, by unanimous vote of the Court, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Brad Spalding is to advertise for a new vehicle for the dead animal disposal program.

USED COMPACTOR - Brad Spalding told Court members that bids will be opened tomorrow for a compactor for the landfill.

## \*\*ROAD DEPARTMENT

HOBBS LN/MURRAYS RUN RD INTERSECTION - Carol Raymond appeared before Nelson Fiscal Court explaining a dangerous situation with the intersection at Hobbs Ln. and Murrays Run Rd.; Ms Raymond brought pictures as a means of explaining the problem there which involves a hill near the intersection, a field with crops that are close to the road and which deter visibility, and a curve at the intersection. Recommendation by County Engineer Jim Lemieux is that the Road Department rebuild the intersection and install a three-way stop. Following discussion, on motion of Judge Watts, second of Jeff Lear, by unanimous vote of the Court, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED to authorize that the County Engineer move forward with rebuilding the Hobbs Ln/Murrays Run Rd intersection.

Notification has been received from the State that there will be about \$40,000 reimbursement for salt.
