I have received a formal request on behalf of Flaget Healthcare, Inc. to accept the subject road as a County Road. See attached aerial picture of area.


The roadway plans for a part of this roadway were submitted to my office May 24, 2006 with approval of this part of the roadway on June 17, 2006. The roadway was then to be extended with plans submitted to my office on Sept 26, 2006. This roadway extension plans were not final approved due to an insufficient Storm Water Management Plan (SDP).

Based on a review of my project folder notes, Flaget Hospital began constructing the roadway in October 2006 (Contracted with Roby Construction). Flaget Hospital did not have proper approval from Planning and Zoning and did not have final approval of the roadway plans/SDP. They were informed in writing that all work was at their own risk, however I would inspect construction work on the road when notified.

Based on my notes, I inspected subgrade construction and the first 3" lift of DGA. (Final inspection notes dated 04/24/07). This work met County minimum standards at that time. All other work was accomplished without notification to my office (Concrete curb construction and asphalt base/surface placement).

If the County wishes to accept this Clayton-Flaget Road as a County Road, then I would recommend the attached minimum requirements (and as we have discussed) be accomplished by Flaget Hospital. We can meet to discuss or discuss at the Fiscal Court meeting tomorrow at your discretion.

1. Prepare Plat and obtain approval from Planning and Zoning- Name the Road. Dedicate a 60 ft wide Right of Way as a public road. The proposed 60 ft Right of Way shall not be shown as a utility Easement.

Note: boundary between proposed Right of Way and Flaget Hospital is the boundary line for the City limits of the City of Bardstown.

2. Prepare "as built" plan and profile of constructed roadway.

3. Prepare and submit construction plans of proposed cul-de-sac-. Cul-de-sac shown on the attached appears adequate as a "permanent turnaround" to this roadway. Construct Cul-de-sac per approved plans.

4. Assure asphalt was constructed to minimum thicknesses required (core drill three locations-patch cored holes). MAGO has provided quantities of asphalt for records

5. Submit a Storm Water Management and Drainage Plan for approval.

The majority of the area this road accesses is currently zoned agriculture. No developmental plan has been provided for this roadway. The County has no way of determining the drainage impact to surrounding properties. Therefore, as a minimum, the SDP shall provide dedicated drainage easements through adjoining properties for the

NOTE: If in the future, the owner of the agricultural land request to re-zone property which may not be compatible with the roadway's minimum design, then the Fiscal Court could/may deny re-zoning or require the roadway to be re-built to a better standard.

6. The roadway is currently being utilized as a Construction Entrance to Flaget Hospital Office building project (currently under construction). The roadway should not be formally accepted until all construction work is completed and any damage to the roadway is properly repaired.

7. Place one inch asphalt surface overlay over roadway prior to final acceptance of roadway and after construction of Flaget office building. (Note: The existing asphalt surface was placed in April 2007.



Dean and Magistrates,

We (Kroger, Steve Jones, Ricky Prewitt, and myself) have reviewed, researched, and test drove several rubber tire loaders for the NCRD. We have looked at three models.

- CAT 924 K,
- John Deere 524 K.
- Volvo L60 G.

Attached is a spread sheet listing basic specifications and costs for the loaders listed above. All models are approximately 22-24 percent larger (heavier) than our current 1994 CAT IT 18 F Caterpillar quit making the IT 18 F machine in 1994. All brands currently sell the larger model and do not really offer a model equal in size to the smaller Cat IT 18 F


I consider all three models basically equal in physical size and abilities to perform all functions needed by the NCRD. All three models are available for direct purchase via a Commonwealth of Kentucky Master Agreement ("State Contract"). All three models are basically equal in price.

After reviewing the basic specifications and talking to sales reps on all three models, the *Cat 924 K* and the *Volvo L 60 G* appeared to have a little better reputation so we test drove each unit (*Cat 924 K* on 03/23/13 and *Volvo L60G* on 04/01/13).

Both units worked fine and will meet the needs of the NCRD. The *Volvo L60 G* appeared to have easier access for maintenance of brakes however the *CAT 924 K* was a hydrostatic model which make it less susceptible to brake wear. The *Volvo* is made in Europe and *CAT* is made North Carolina, USA.

**My recommendation is to purchase the CAT 924 K through the Commonwealth of Kentucky's Master Agreement (# KY MA 758 130000667 1) for the amount of ~ \$139,277.00.** I have been assured all existing tools the NCRD currently utilizes with the IT 18 F (Road Broom, Grab& Grip Bucket (for bulky item) and equipment forks) will work on the *CAT 924. K*.


