The Humane Society of Nelson County succeeded in re-homing 1,355 dogs and cats. Of those, adoption to individuals accounted for 262 placements. Transfers to rescue organizations resulted in 1,093 additional placements.

This year, the return to owner (RTO) figure for dogs was 222 (19.5% of all dogs entering shelter) and for cats, 34 (2.5%), both exceeding the national averages of 16% and 2%. Return of cats is definitely improved by our offering owners free or low cost spay/neuter surgery, and by identification through increased use of microchips. Unfortunately, we have not received any large spay/neuter grants since 2017 since grant criteria have changed over the years to favor much larger programs than we can offer. We do absorb clinic costs as much as our limited budget allows in order to prevent the births of more kittens likely to be euthanized at our shelter.

In 2019, the live release rate for canines increased to an encouraging 84% for the year, primarily due to the large increase in transfers to rescue organizations in northern states and Canada. This year the improvement in live release of cats and kittens is attributable to our new partnership with Kentucky Humane Society. They supply cats and kittens to the Purr-fect Day Cat Café in Louisville, which placed over 1,500 felines in new homes in 2019.

Nationally, live release rates vary greatly, and are affected by demographics and admission policies. Our LRR is probably above average for an open admission, rural shelter in the southeastern United States, and our goal is to improve it every year by decreasing intake through spay/neuter services, and increasing adoptions, transfers and return of pets to owners.

There were 22 other dispositions in 2019, including accounting for about 1% of our animals, and these animals were brought in dead on arrival, died in shelter, escaped, stolen or otherwise unaccounted for. Statistics listed above are based on outcome figures, and vary slightly from the following intake numbers because of animals remaining in the shelter at end of each year.

In 2019, a total of 2,698 animals were logged in to the shelter: 1,190 dogs and pups, 1,443 cats and kittens, and 65 other species. Other species consist of "pocket pets" (bunnies, guinea pigs, rats, etc.), exotics, wildlife, and livestock. Overall, intake increased by 217 animals, based on comparison with last year's log. On the last day of 2019, 86 animals (46 dogs and 42 cats) were under our care, with the majority housed in the two buildings which make up the shelter facility, and a few in foster care.

This year, we again participated in the national program, Shelter Animals Count, which gathers statistics on animal shelters. This program requires monthly reporting on canines and felines only, and differentiates between adults and juveniles, strays and surrenders, adoptions, transfers, and euthanasia. Voluntary enrollment in this study makes us eligible for certain grants and other benefits from national organizations. Clinic Activity

In addition to spay/neuter services, our clinic also serves low-income owners who are often desperate to obtain veterinary attention for their pets. This year Dr. Perkins saw 112 owners with ill or injured animals (72 cats and 40 dogs). The Humane Society also enabled 39 qualifying owners to take their pets to local veterinarians by financially assisting them with a total of \$3,300 in funds from the Don Perkins Memorial Fund. This service truly advances our mission statement, "to alleviate suffering among animals."

The Humane Society Clinic spayed and neutered 1,143 free-roaming owned or "neighborhood/community" cats, but only one dog belonging to a low-income owner. We had to quit doing surgeries for owned dogs because of the increased number of shelter dogs that must be altered before transfer to northern rescue organizations. We refer low-income dog owners to nearby low-cost clinics in Louisville, Lexington, etc

Our clinic spayed and neutered 513 shelter cats and dogs before release to new owners. All other transferred pets were found to be already altered upon intake to our shelter or received surgery at the many reputable rescues we use. Prevention of unwanted litters is by far the most effective means for decreasing the number of animals coming into the shelter.

Though there was a slight increase in intake this year, the overall outlook is encouraging in that the live release rates are up, and euthanasia rates down. In fact, euthanasia of dogs and puppies has decreased from 525 in 2016 to 171 in 2019, largely as a result of our transfer/relocation effort. Continuing this trend is dependent upon collaboration between Animal Control and the Humane Society, and assures a positive image for the Nelson County Animal Shelter which the general public views as a single entity, often unaware that it is actually comprised of both county government and a non-profit organization.
