As I am sure you know, Time Warner NY Cable LLC ("TWN") has entered into an agreement with Adelphia Communications Corporation ("Adelphia") (the "Transaction") to purchase the cable system serving your community. 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## ORDINANCE AMENDING TRANSIENT ROOM TAX ORDINANCE (SECOND READING)

KOC NUMBER 220.002A -1

AN ORDINANCE AMENDED AND ADOPTING AS AMENDED THE \_\_\_\_\_, 2002 ORDINANCE OF THE NELSON FISCAL COURT REGARDING A TRANSIENT ROOM TAX FOR ACCOMMODATIONS BUSINESSES.

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE NELSON COUNTY FISCAL COURT AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BARDSTOWN THAT SECTIONS 5 OF SAID ORDINANCE BE AMENDED, AS FOLLOWS:

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UPON MOTION OF Raymond Greer, SECONDED BY Roy Drake, AND  
A VOTE BEING HAD AND THE COUNTY JUDGE ANNOUNCING THAT THE  
MOTION CARRIED,

WHEREAS Sections 91A.350, 91A.360 and 91A.370 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes,  
authorized the establishment of a recreational, tourist and convention commission, and

WHEREAS the City of Bardstown and Nelson County acting jointly on behalf of their respective  
entity, have and hereby establish a Bardstown and Nelson County Recreational, Tourist and  
Convention Commission, and that said Commission has submitted its annual budget establishing  
a request for funds for the operation of the Commission for the calendar year of January 1, 1974  
through December 31, 1974 in the total amount of \$10,500.00 all as provided by KRS 91A.370.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDERED AND RESOLVED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF  
NELSON COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AND THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF  
BARDSTOWN, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:


SECTION 5: That any taxes, fines, penalties, or other charges that remain outstanding after the  
20<sup>th</sup> of each month shall be assessed a 2 % fine for each violation, with each 1-to-30 day period  
constituting a violation. There is a minimum penalty of \$ 10.00 regardless of the amount of tax  
due, if any. Also, any unpaid fines, taxes, or penalties, for the purpose of this section, shall be  
assessed a penalty of not less than \$20.00 and not more than \$5000 for each offense. Each 1-to-  
30 day period past due shall constitute a separate offense.

Adopted this 21st day of June, 2005, by 5 ayes and 0 nays.

**Subject:** Kentucky Rural Heritage Development Initiative

Nelson County has been asked to participate in a grant application for a Rural  
Heritage Development Initiative pilot project. This project will be very beneficial  
to our community and region. Below is a description of the project and bullet  
points.

If the grant application is approved, each county must match with \$15,000 over 3  
years. After a meeting last week with P&Z members, it was determined that with  
approval of the legislative bodies, P&Z would utilize excess fees for our local  
match.

Part of the grant application requires a resolution from all legislative bodies as well  
as from the local economic development, tourism, planning and zoning,  
Renaissance, etc. Based on their sample resolution, I have put together a joint  
resolution that all agencies could submit (see attached)

Because this grant is due July 1, we will need this resolution passed quickly. I  
hope you all will support this project and ask your councils, commissions, boards,  
etc. to approve the resolution.

### Kentucky Rural Heritage Development Initiative

The National Trust for Historic Preservation, with support from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation, will work with  
regional and state partners to carry out a **national demonstration initiative for heritage-based economic  
development in two selected rural regions**. Heritage tourism, local product and skill development, and other  
preservation-based strategies will be used as alternative models for rural regions to diversify their economy,  
focusing on rural heritage as an economic and social asset.
